We ended 2021 with a very successful **Pamper Pack** meeting in December, delivering 157 pamper packs, fashion scarves, socks, briefs, sanitary items, knitted children's teddy bears, books and 100 plus pre-loved handbags and travel bags direct to the Salvation Army. Our thanks to Yarra City Council for their grant of \$1000 and thanks to Sharon Karasmanis for the paperwork to make this happen. Birthing Kits

We are again planning a Birthing Kit Assembly event in conjunction with Fire Services Victoria. As last year, it will most likely be done in small groups around Mothers' Day.

We are also planning to assist two secondary schools with their Assembly Days. The first of these will be in March with Ivanhoe Girls Grammar School.



What's in a Birthing Kit?

Birthing Kits are now environmentally friendly.

Each \$5 'Earth Kit' includes a biodegradable sheet and bag that leave no chemical footprint. 100 trees are planted for every 200 kits made. Each kit contains:

- Soap to wash the birth attendant's hands and the mother's perineum
- Plastic sheet to prevent the mother and newborn coming into contact with the ground or an unhygienic surface
- Gloves to cover the birth attendant's hands and provide protection from infections such as HIV for carers and recipients
- Gauze to clean the mother's perineum prior to giving birth and to wipe clear the newborn baby's eyes
- · Cord ties to cleanly tie the umbilical cord

Advocacy Matters

An Area 1 Advocacy committee was set up in August 2020 with support from D23 Chair of Advocacy, Christine Hepburn, Area 1 Director, Trish McLean, and Area 2,(which has been undertaking advocacy for many years).

The Area 1 committee set itself the following goals:

- Educate ourselves and our Clubs on Advocacy. Committee members were to present a Power Point titled "From Awareness to Action: the importance pf Collective Advocacy".
- Share resources between A1 clubs.
- Create a speakers list to include both Zontians and non-Zontians.
- Select 4 themes for the Zonta year and create a peak body list for each theme. Where possible, identify an action related to the selected theme for that quarter.

After the combined Area meeting in May 2021, Area 4 & Area 1 decided to join to create the **Area 1 & 4 Advocacy Committee**. We discussed what had worked, and what could be done differently going forward. Some Clubs reported that members were not fully accepting of some advocacy activities, such as completing online petitions.

The topics covered so far include Climate action, Girls Not Brides, and every club participated in several activities associated with the 16 Days of Advocacy.

The Power Point Girls Not Brides was revised and shared with all Area 1 & 4 Clubs.

In the months leading up to the 16 Days of Activism, Areas 1 and 4 were able to share resources, and in some cases, support each other's activity. A full report is with each Club and an Area report published in NewsFlash.

Our current topic is financial literacy for women.

Financial Literacy is the ability to understand and effectively use various financial skills. Financial literacy is the foundation of your relationship with money, and it is a lifelong journey. In a discussion paper by Economic Security for Women (ES4W), it stated that many of the problems identified in women's financial security are linked to financial literacy.

Area Advocacy committee has identified many age groups which are vulnerable to financial crisis. These include School age to first job, 18–25-year-olds, motherhood and superannuation, mature aged working women, and seniors. Women in a financial crisis includes causes such as health, loss of work, relationship breakdown and family violence.

Many peak bodies who care for women in Domestic or Family violence crisis have a program to assist with financial education.

There are considerable resources available for women and girls to access on the topic of Financial Literacy, including on banking websites and partner organisations such as MoneySmart.gov. Many of these resources are attached to services which are tertiary (that is reacting to the plight of women) rather than primary (preventative).

There are many types of domestic and family violence. They could include physical violence as well as emotional abuse and financial abuses. Financial abuse is a form of domestic and family violence where the abuser uses money or finances to control the other person.

Women are being alerted to these resources as a *result* of their contact with these services, rather than knowing of their existence *prior* to a crisis. A major focus of this issue is to empower women and girls through financial awareness and education.

- How do we make women more aware of these resources?
- How do women protect themselves from financial abuse?
- What happens when you give access to your accounts to others? And for seniors, how can you protect yourself from elder financial abuse?
- Can Zontions advocate for government policy related to banking, credit card misuse, and Buy now Pay Later (BNPL) regulations?
- Can Zonta be a leader in promoting the conversation around women and girls having access to information on women's full financial empowerment and wellbeing?
- Can Zonta partner with another organisation to spread the message?

This topic will be continued.
